Spring “Clean-Up Safety Tips

Spring is now upon us and our thoughts turn to cleaning up from the long winter, making repairs around the home and enjoying the outdoors. While clearing out unwanted items, it is also a good time to check your home for unsafe conditions. Here are a few safety tips to help you perform your annual spring cleaning and to ensure that your family has a safe spring.



Outside and Around the Yard:

- Make sure your address numbers are visible from the street.
- Clean up yard debris. Cut back dead limbs and grass.
- Maintain a clear fire zone of 10' around structures. Clean-up leaves and debris and consider using stone, or non-combustible mulches.
- Check outdoor electrical outlets and other electrical appliances.
- Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.

In the Garage or Shed:

- Clean and properly store paints, pool and yard chemicals.
- Check fuel containers for leaks and make sure they are properly stored.
- Have all power equipment cleaned, serviced and ready for use.



Free Smoke Alarm inspections & Installations for Senior Citizens

One of the most important fire safety devices for the home is a smoke alarm. When working smoke alarms are present, your chances of surviving a home fire double. It is estimated that a third of smoke alarms are not working, often due to the failure to replace a worn, out battery. Smoke alarms should be tested monthly and batteries replaced annually. All smoke alarms should be replaced when they are 10 years old. The Cherry Hill Fire Department understands that Senior Citizens may not be able to afford, test, or change the battery in their smoke alarm; therefore, that service is provided for you. If you need a smoke alarm or are not sure that yours are in proper working order, please call to schedule an appointment. If it needs to be replaced, the Fire Department will install a 10-year long life battery powered smoke alarm free of charge. Every home needs working smoke alarms! Please call us at (856)429-7441.
