Yard Cleanup Reminders

Grass clippings, leaves and hedge trimmings are to be placed in paper lawn/leaf bags or placed into open cans up to 50 gallon capacity weighing less than 50



lbs. for your weekly collection. Do not put yard waste in plastic bags, they will not be collected. Branches must be cut to less than 4 ft and tied in bundles, or placed into open cans up to 50 gallon capacity weighing less than 50 lbs.

Preparation of Trash

Trash shall be placed in the 95 gl. or 64 gl. Township-issued green trash cart with handles facing the house. **As of 2016, trash bags outside of the cart or in non-Township carts will not be collected.**

If additional trash and/or recycle carts are needed, they may be borrowed for 1 or 2 weeks, or they can be purchased. Call Public Works for further details.

Appliances, Metal Items

Refrigerators, freezers, grills, stoves, washers, dryers and other metal items are collected once a week on a Wednesday by calling Public Works at 856-424-4422 no later than 3 p.m. the Tuesday before.

Bulk Trash too large to fit into your trash cart such as mattresses, box springs, couches and chairs may be placed curbside for collection on your regularly scheduled collection day, but must have a 4ft. clearance from the cart to allow for the automated arm operation.

Did you know?

Effective January 1, 2011, per "State of New Jersey Electronics Waste Management Act"

Residents are no longer permitted to place their TVs, computers, or computer related items at the curb as trash; they must now be recycled at an Electronics Recycling Facility.

Residents may take them to the following locations for safe and proper recycling free of charge:

Holiday Trash Schedule

Trash, recyclables or yard waste will not be collected on the following holidays:

- ◆ New Year's Day
- ◆ Memorial Day
- ◆ July 4th
- ◆ Labor Day
- ◆ Thanksgiving Day
- ◆ Christmas

Collection will be the following day, all other days remain the same.

RECYCLING - FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q. How do I know which plastics are recyclable?

A. Plastic containers #1 & #2 are recyclable; the numbers can be found at the bottom of the container. All other plastics would go into the green Cherry Hill issued trash can.

Q. How do I dispose of plastic bags since they cannot go into the Blue Recycle Tote?

A. Plastic bags may be dropped off at Public Works, 1 Perina Blvd Monday through Friday 7:30am to 4:00pm. or dropped off at "big shopping centers" i.e. ShopRite, WaWa, Target, Wegmans, Acme, etc. Bags must be empty and free of trash, paper or other items.

Q. When do I put out sofas, chairs, mattresses, toilets, etc.?

A. These items are considered "BULK" and should go out on your regular trash day. A separate truck should arrive to collect by the end of the day (about 6pm). Trash in plastic bags are not considered bulk. If missed, please call the Department of Public Works at (856) 424-4422 the morning following your collection.

Q. What do I do with bicycles, hot water heaters, household appliances and large pieces of metal?

A. Call the Department of Public Works at (856) 424-4422 to schedule a White Goods Wednesday pickup.

Q. The Recycling Truck just took my Recycling but left my Yard Waste, why?

A. Vegetative Waste (Yard Waste) is picked up by a separate truck as a organic recyclable item later in the same day.

Q. Can residents recycle shredded paper?

A. No. Once paper is shredded it may go into your green Cherry Hill issued tote as trash.

Q. How can I dispose of tires, used motor oil and batteries*?

A. Bring used oil, car and household batteries and tires (off the rim) to the Department of Public Works building, 1 Perina Blvd. or save these items for Camden County Hazardous Waste collection day. *Ordinary batteries: regular alkaline, manganese, and carbon-zinc batteries are not considered hazardous waste and can be disposed of with ordinary trash. Other common single use or rechargeable batteries such as lithium and button batteries are recyclable and may be dropped off at DPW.

Q. Can residents get additional Recycling and/or Trash totes (95/64 gal blue/green totes)?

A. Yes! Residents are able to purchase additional totes for a onetime payment, check or money order only, of \$50.00 made out to Cherry Hill Township. Payment may be mailed to 820 Mercer St with attention to the Department of Public Works on the envelope or dropped off at 1 Perina Blvd, Monday through Friday 7:30am to 4:00pm. Please include best contact phone number and your normally scheduled collection date.
